Acrylic paints are incredibly versatile and have come a long way in the last few years. The variety of ways to use acrylic paint can be confusing all by itself, but we've got you!

This guide will help you approach painting with a sense of play, so that you can build the confidence to step up to the easel with joy every time.

## Paint SMALLER.

Tip 1:

Big canvases are super impressive - and fun! But when you are first starting out, it is easier to make progress faster if you paint a bit smaller. It takes less time per painting and you can practice more!

## Paint MORE.

Tip 2:

Paint a LOT. The more often you paint, and the more you paint, the more progress you will make, faster! You'll solve problems and learn things quicker.

"Be your own best friend! So easy to be hard on oneself! Try to paint as often as possible. Every second counts as practice." - Katja

## Use a BIGGER brush.

Tip 3:

Bigger brushes force you to loosen up and not capture every detail. Try going a little bigger than feels comfortable.

#### Get some DISTANCE.

Tip 4:

Try standing to paint! When you get further back from your painting, you use your whole body and get bigger strokes.

# Place your stroke with PURPOSE.

Tip 5:

Instead of blending, take a moment and put each stroke down with purpose and thought. If you don't like it, you can always cover it up! This will help keep your painting fresh and not looking overworked.

"Be yourself. Have fun and keep reminding yourself that if theres something you think you did wrong, just trust the process (as Shelby says) and wait until you're finished!" - Sharon

#### **Trust YOURSELF**

Tip G:

As you are learning, start forming opinions.

WHY do you like or dislike something? WHAT are you drawn to? Noticing these things and asking these questions will help you develop your own unique style as you evolve as an artist!

# Learn to SEE

Tip 7:

As you're learning to paint, you can train your brain to see so that you can make progress faster. Take a moment and appreciate that gorgeous sunset you see. Really see and observe the colors around you!

#### **Have FUN!**

Tip 8:

There is NO bikini season in art. It's JUST paint! Don't take yourself too seriously, and just enjoy the process!

# Copy, but don't STEAL

Tip 9:

When we're first learning, we have to copy.

That's how we learn. Find a good instructor and learn step-by-step. Then copy your favorite artists to figure out WHAT you like. But create your own style and artwork to share with the world and don't put someone else's work out as your own.

Your story is more interesting anyways.
